

Pakistan Embassy in Muscat Marks Marka-e-Haq Anniversary

Muscat, Oman — The Embassy of Pakistan in Muscat observed the first anniversary of Pakistan's victory in Marka-e-Haq in a dignified and very well-attended event today.

A large segment of the Pakistani-Omani community participated in the ceremony. Messages from the leadership were read out by the Deputy Head of Mission and the Defence Attaché. Speeches highlighting various aspects of Marka-e-Haq were delivered by Dr. Saadia Fatima (Head of Department, Al-Zahra College Muscat), Mr. Ameer Hamza (Chairman, Pakistan Schools Oman), Mr. Zahid Shakoor (Acting Chairman, Pakistan Social Club), and Dr. Dileep Kumar, a distinguished member of the Pakistani-Hindu community in Oman.

Renowned poet Mr. Qamar Riaz recited a poem as a tribute to the Armed Forces of Pakistan. Three national songs released by ISPR were also screened during the event.
