

The Crucial role of decolonisation and protests in Palestine's freedom struggle

While Gaza has been the focus for over a year, marked by destruction and death under Israeli aggression, the narrative has often been framed by Western media as starting only on October 7, 2023. Their lands have been occupied, homes demolished, and lives reduced to trauma.

Yet, despite this overwhelming oppression, Palestinians have persisted. Their resistance against these colonial crimes stands as a powerful act of decolonisation. Whether through local resistance or international protests over the past year, decolonisation remains key to the ultimate goal of Palestinian freedom.
