Jens Stoltenberg honored with Germany's order of Merit

BERLIN: Former NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg was awarded Germany's prestigious "Grand Cross" Order of Merit for his contributions to European security and strengthening transatlantic ties. The award was presented by German President Frank-Walter Steinmeier during a ceremony at Bellevue Palace.
