MIRPUR (AJK): November 27: Day-long seminar on Climate Change and Youth's Role in Mitigating it's impacts urged for the urgent need for youth-led climate action and fostering community resilience in Azad Jammu Kashmir.

The Pakistan Red Crescent Society (PRCS) Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJK) State Branch in collaboration with University of Azad Jammu & Kashmir (UAJK) organized a seminar on "Climate Change and the Role of Youth in addressing it's impacts" at University of Azad Jammu & Kashmir jehlum Valley Campus Hattian in Muzaffarabad Division on Tuesday.
