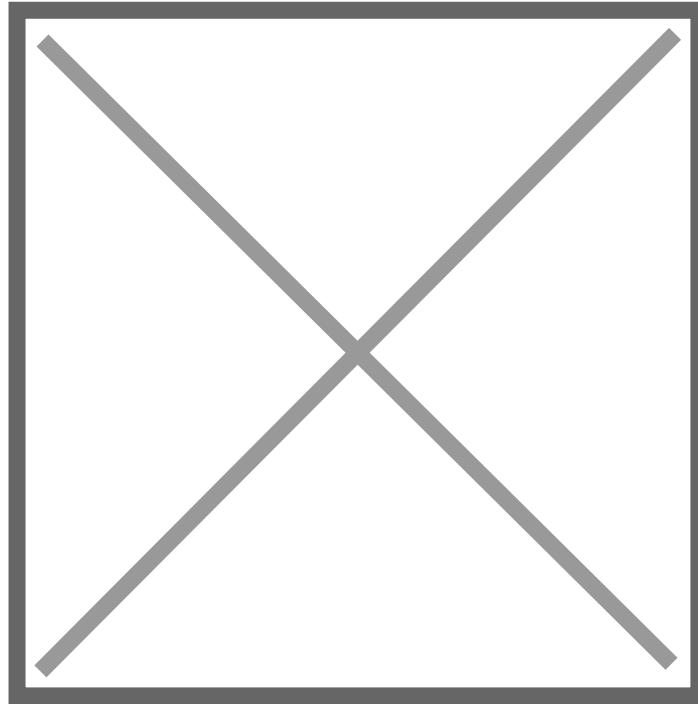


Qatar Amir, British Prime Minister hold official talks session

London, December 04 (QNA) – HH the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani held Wednesday

an official talks session with HE Prime Minister of the United Kingdom Sir Keir Starmer in

Downing Street.

Both sides discussed bilateral relations and ways to boost them alongside ways to benefit at all levels from the opportunities available to both nations, especially in economy, investment, education and defense.

They also took stock of regional and international issues of common concern, particularly the developments in the Gaza Strip and the occupied Palestinian territories.
