

Trump declares new era of National Success in inaugural address

WASHINGTON, D.C.—In his second inaugural address, President Donald Trump vowed to lead the country into a "new era of national success" while proclaiming that America's "decline is over."

The 47th president of the United States emphasized that a "golden age" for America is beginning immediately, with promises to restore national sovereignty, balance justice, and create a nation that is "proud, prosperous, and free."

Speaking to the nation on January 20, 2025, Trump outlined his vision for a reinvigorated America, where the government would prioritize the welfare of the American people above all. "From this day forward, our country will flourish and be respected again," he declared. He also vowed that the U.S. would no longer be "taken advantage of" on the world stage.

Trump stated, "I have been tested and challenged more than any president in our 250-year history," pointing to the numerous obstacles he faced, including an assassination attempt during the 2024 campaign.

Trump also acknowledged the trust crisis within the government, stating that his election is a "mandate" to reverse past betrayals. "America's decline is over," he said, signaling a return to strength and pride for the nation.

Despite frigid temperatures that forced the ceremony indoors for the first time in four decades,

Trump delivered a confident message to the nation, reflecting on his personal journey, including
his miraculous survival after a bullet narrowly missed his ear during a rally in Pennsylvania. He
stressed that his survival was "for a reason," reaffirming his commitment to making America
great again.

On his first day in office, Trump is set to take over 200 executive actions, tackling issues from border security to energy policy. Key measures include deploying the military to the U.S.-Mexico border, withdrawing from international climate agreements, and reversing key Biden-era policies. Trump's actions aim to cut living costs for Americans, secure the nation's borders, and challenge the federal bureaucracy.

With bold plans ahead, Trump remains determined to implement the policies that propelled him back to the White House, ushering in a new era of leadership for the United States.
