Although the leaders have enjoyed friendly relations in the past, with Modi visiting Trump in 2017 and 2019, trade has remained a point of contention. Trump recently urged Modi for fairer trade terms in a phone call. The two leaders also discussed strengthening the Quad grouping with Australia and Japan, seen as a counterbalance to China.

The meeting comes after the U.S. returned 104 Indian migrants, following Trump's overhaul of immigration policy. India has expressed firm opposition to illegal migration, but acknowledges that deportations are not new. More than 15,000 Indians have been deported from the U.S. since 2009.
