Through these activities, they not only developed a deeper understanding of the skills required for careers in media and communications but also honed their creativity, teamwork, and problem-solving abilities in a professional setting.

Mohammed Ahmed Al-Kubaisi, Senior Career Programs and Services Officer at QCDC, emphasized the importance of Qatar Foundation's involvement in launching this year's edition: "Qatar Foundation's participation underscores our shared commitment to fostering early career exploration.
