


Global Media highlights Qatar Amir's visit to Tehran

Doha, February 20 (QNA) – International media extensively covered HH the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani's visit to Iran, analyzing its timing, key discussions, and bilateral talks with Iranian President Dr. Masoud Pezeshkian. Several media outlets hosted political analysts to comment on the visit's significance.

BBC Arabic highlighted that the Iranian President praised Qatar's role in brokering the Gaza

ceasefire deal. The report noted that both leaders, during their joint press conference, stressed the urgency of halting the war in Gaza and delivering humanitarian aid. Additionally, they underscored respect for the Syrian people's choices and discussed enhancing ties between Iran and the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states.

France 24's Arabic edition described HH the Amir's visit to Tehran as notable, emphasizing discussions on Gaza and regional stability. The channel reported that the Iranian President expressed gratitude for Qatar's mediation efforts in achieving the ceasefire and reiterated the strong ties between both nations. A France 24 correspondent in Tehran cited the Iranian President's remarks, emphasizing Iran's commitment to strengthening political, economic, and cultural relations with Qatar as part of its broader regional strategy.

Turkish Radio and Television Corporation (TRT) also covered the visit, focusing on the leaders' joint commitment to upholding the Gaza ceasefire and facilitating increased humanitarian aid. Additionally, ART quoted HH the Amir's remarks at the press conference, where he reaffirmed Qatar's dedication, alongside its mediation partners, to ensuring the ceasefire's success. He stressed the need for sustained humanitarian efforts, ending civilian suffering, and working toward a comprehensive and just resolution in Gaza.

The visit highlighted Qatar's diplomatic role in regional stability, with both leaders reaffirming

their commitment to constructive dialogue and lasting peace.
