He outlined ongoing projects aimed at establishing a Green Strategic Corridor for renewable energy through the Caspian and Black Seas to Europe. Uzbekistan's efforts in expanding solar and wind power capacity, as well as fostering collaboration on green technologies, align with the EU's goals for decarbonization.

Security Cooperation and Afghanistan

The summit will also address common security concerns, including terrorism, extremism, and transnational crime. President Mirziyoyev highlighted Uzbekistan's proactive stance in promoting regional stability, particularly through its engagement with Afghanistan. Uzbekistan's pragmatic approach aims to integrate Afghanistan into regional infrastructure projects, offering opportunities for long-term development.
