
Prince William to attend Pope's funeral with world leaders

Prince William will represent the British royal family at the state funeral of Pope Francis, joining world leaders including U.S. President Donald Trump and French President Emmanuel Macron in Vatican City. Buckingham Palace confirmed Prince William's attendance, describing it as a gesture of the royal family's deep respect for the late Pontiff, who passed away earlier this week after a prolonged illness.
