

Trump and Zelensky discuss Ukraine crisis at St. Peter's Basilica

Vatican City: Former U.S. President Donald Trump and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky held a rare and discreet meeting inside St. Peter's Basilica ahead of the funeral of Pope Benedict XVI. The two leaders reportedly discussed the ongoing war in Ukraine and explored potential strategies for international support and conflict resolution.

Sources indicated that Trump emphasized continued backing for Ukraine's sovereignty, while

Zelensky reiterated the urgent need for increased military and financial assistance from Western allies. The conversation remained private, and no official statements were issued following their meeting.

Their talks came at a moment when global attention was focused on the solemn funeral ceremony for Pope Benedict XVI. However, the conversation between Trump and Zelensky drew particular media attention, raising new discussions about the evolving dynamics of global diplomacy amid ongoing tensions in Eastern Europe.
