In a significant breakthrough amid ongoing ceasefire talks, Hamas has released Edan Alexander, a 21-year-old American-Israeli soldier, after 584 days in captivity. The release, facilitated through diplomatic channels, is viewed as a goodwill gesture aimed at advancing negotiations between Hamas and Israel.
