

US Department of State Regional Spokesperson to QNA: Trump's Visit to Qatar Reflects Strength of Bilateral Relations.

Washington, May 14 (QNA) – Regional Spokesperson for the US Department of State, Michael Mitchell, stated that President Donald Trump's visit to Qatar highlights the strength of US-Qatar ties and reflects Washington's commitment to enhancing diplomatic, security, and economic cooperation in the Gulf.

He noted that the US values the deep economic integration with Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries, with Qatar being a leading partner.

Mitchell further noted Qatar's significant role in addressing humanitarian issues in Gaza, supporting aid delivery, and contributing to ceasefire efforts, which the US greatly values. He added that Qatar's diplomatic initiatives have been instrumental in easing tensions and providing critical support to conflict-affected areas.

Concluding his remarks, Mitchell said President Trump's visit reaffirms the United States' commitment to regional stability and prosperity, with Gulf Cooperation Council-US relations remaining vital for security and development. He expressed optimism that the visit would pave the way for stronger defense ties, broader economic engagements, and enhanced strategic cooperation that benefit both nations and the wider region.
