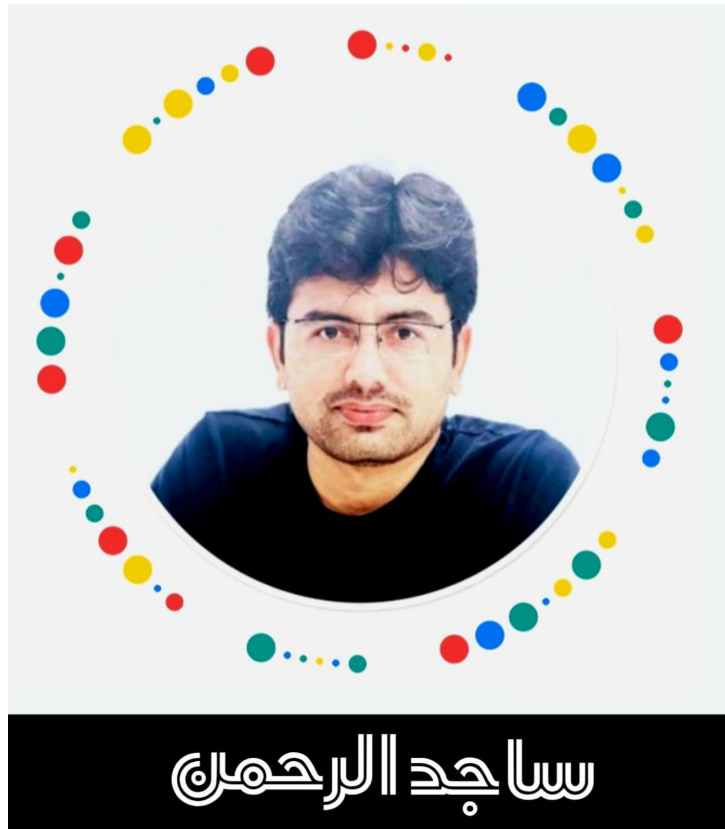


## Mianwali Police's Transformative Community Policing Initiatives \* Empowering Youth and Building Trust
