

Kashmiris are cause winners: Ex AJK Govt. Advisor:

MIRPUR (AJK): July 1st: "Kashmiris have already won their just cause of right to self-determination legally endorsed by the United Nations Security Council back in 1948 and 1949", said Hameed Shaheen Alvi, former AJK Government Adviser.

Addressing a ceremony hosted in his honour by Convener Jammu Kashmir Free Media Association here on Tuesday, he recalled that the UN resolutions of August 13, 1948 and of January 5, 1949 recognize document-wise Kashmiris self-determination right. "Both resolutions form a UN lawful mandate", he added. Entire international community of nations as members of the UN organization subscribe to those historic resolutions, he explained.

Alvi emphasized that now was the time to dispatch teams of Kashmiris having complete background and foreground of Jammu and Kashmir saga to the voluntary international forums to elicit their support on implementing those Kashmir resolutions.

He maintained that implementation shall save the prestige of the UNO and shall save peace in the Kashmir located Asian region. Kashmiris should project their cause as self-determination right denied people; militarized

usurper of this right was India whose about one million armed forces have practically cordoned off Kashmir's geography, life of humans, even livings of animals; international forums should be shown the satellite imagery of Indian occupation apparatus, he explained

Alvi, also retired Inspector General of AJK Prisons Department, said that in over dozens of Kashmir International Delegations he has been a Member/Secretary during his professional life.

He happened to talk directly to representatives of socio-political international bodies; after explaining the raison d'etre of the Kashmir dispute the forums representatives felt themselves fully educated and supportive to Kashmir dispute truth, he told.

"At the home front he said there was a need to prepare Kashmir cause youth intellect massively to have them firm on the centrality of this dispute, an unsolved offshoot of history, he concluded.
