


Bulgaria, China Mark WWII Victory, Urge Global Cooperation

Sofia University professor Alexandar Nikolov echoed this message, emphasizing that the UN continues to play a vital role in conflict resolution and dialogue. He noted that today's interconnected world makes international solidarity more critical than ever.

The gathering served as a timely reminder of the enduring relevance of unity, historical memory, and global collaboration in preserving peace.
