MIRPUR (AJK); August 6: A hearing and speech impaired special student from AJK's Kashmir Institute of Special Education (KISE) Ms. Tayyaba Majeed secured distinction as she successfully completed her Bachelor of Arts degree program studies in Grade – A from the University of Faisalabad bringing glory to Azad Jammu Kashmir, it was officially said.

According to details, Tayyaba Majeed, a student of Kashmir Institute of Special Education (KISE), a free education institution for deaf and hard of hearing students and students, which used to communicate in sign language, functioning in Mirpur AJK under the auspices of Ansari Welfare Trust.

The special child student passed the annual BA examination from Government University College Faisalabad with distinction, KISE Director Dr. Amjad Ansari, told our Special Jammu Kashmir state Correspondent Altaf Hamid Rao here on Wednesday.

Dr. Amjad Ansari said that Tayyaba Majeed was the first student of KISE to pass the BA examination from the He added that due to the lack of graduation facilities for deaf and hard of hearing students at Azad Kashmir University, we have to send these special students to Punjab and in other provinces for the higher studies.

He further said that before this, four students of KISE have completed their BA education from Federal Urdu University and the biggest problem in Azad Jammi Kashmir stands in providing employment to special students after completion of their professional

Dr. Ansari suggested to Azad Kashmir government that the special students should be provided with respectable employment besides higher studies in various professional disciplines in the public sector universities located in AJK.
