The Embassy of Pakistan in Qatar brought together Pakistan's rich literary heritage and patriotic spirit by hosting an Independence Day celebration at its auditorium. The evening, dedicated to poetry, turned into a cultural gathering that resonated with the essence of Urdu literature and the pride of national identity.

The event, held under the auspices of Ambassador HE Muhammed Aamir, drew a large audience from the Pakistani community, eager to celebrate their beloved homeland through Urdu poetry. The programme was presided over by the Defence Attaché at the Embassy, Mr Sher Wali Khan, while noted businessman and community leader Mr Israr Malazai attended as Chief Guest.
