Doha, **November 8 (QNA)** – The Permanent Mission of the State of Qatar to the United Nations in

New York hosted a high-level dinner in Doha, bringing together women leaders participating in

the **Second World Summit for Social Development** to discuss women's leadership and digital innovation for sustainable development.

Held at the Museum of Islamic Art, the event honored **HE Annalena Baerbock**, President of the **80**th Session of the UN General Assembly, and **HE Amina Mohammed**, Deputy Secretary-General of the United Nations.
