"To advance the cause more effectively, a joint strategy would be formulated in collaboration with the Hurriyat leadership", Faisal added while talking to a delegation of the All Parties Hurriyat Conference (APHC), which called on gim at Jammu Kashmir House in the federal metropolis on Wednesday under the leadership of its Convener Ghulam Muhammad Safi. Paying tribute to the unparalleled struggle of Hurriyat leaders imprisoned in Indian jails, he said the Indian government has been using prolonged detentions as a tool to punish Kashmiri leaders.

The PM stressed the need for coordinated efforts and mutual consultation among all Kashmiri stakeholders to evolve a comprehensive strategy for taking the freedom movement to its logical conclusion. The Hurriyat delegation thanked the Prime Minister and assured him of its full support.
