MIRPUR (AJK): November 27 (APP): Azad Jammu Kashmir Prime Minister Faisal Mumtaz Rathore reiterated his government's resolve to work closely with overseas Kashmiris, recognising them as

an essential pillar in advocacy, development, and social welfare, official sources said.

He was talking to an Overseas Kashmiris delegation which called on him at Jammu Kashmir House in the federal metropolis on Thursday, official sources told APP on Thursday.

He praised JKSDMI for its decades-long international campaign and reaffirmed his administration's commitment to strengthening global engagement on the Kashmir issue.
