Doha, Qatar, 16 December 2025: Qatar Foundation's BilAraby initiative has announced the opening of registration for institutions and organizations to exhibit their innovative experiences

and solutions at the BilAraby Gathering 2026. The event is scheduled to take place in Education City, Doha, in April, under the theme “With Our Ideas, We Build.”
