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## Qatar's "Stay Green in Education" Initiative Champions Sustainability, Peace, and Community Engagement

These hands-on exercises reinforced the integration of theory with practice, helping students internalize environmental responsibility.

Beyond environmental education, the program promoted peace, tolerance, and interfaith dialogue. Drawing inspiration from Her Highness Sheikha Moza bint Nasser Al-Missned, Dr. Mirvat Ibrahim stressed that education rooted in dialogue and mutual respect fosters a cohesive society, mitigates extremism, and encourages coexistence across cultures and religions. Students participated in role-playing, group discussions, and presentations that highlighted cooperation, empathy, and community engagement, enhancing their understanding of social harmony. The initiative concluded with the proposal of a school-wide “Green Day,” combining media education, Arabic language, Islamic values, and sustainability workshops. This day aims to transform temporary activities into a sustainable school culture, engaging students as active participants in building a better and greener future while inspiring faculty and staff to integrate sustainability into the curriculum and daily school operations.
