MIRPUR (AJK): March 13: Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) observed World Kidney Day on

Thursday along with the rest of the world, with the primary objective of raising public awareness

about the vital role of kidneys in the human body and encouraging preventive measures to reduce

the growing incidence of kidney diseases.

According to reports from Mirpur, World Kidney Day is observed annually on March 13 as part of a global initiative led by the International Society of Nephrology in collaboration with health institutions and organizations across various countries.

In Mirpur, a special awareness event was organized at the Free Kidney Dialysis Center, Divisional Teaching Hospital, under the auspices of the NGO Anjuman Falah-e-Behbood Insaniya Mirpur.
