MIRPUR (AJK): March 18: A talented student from Mirpur, Azad Jammu and Kashmir, has earned distinction at the international level as part of a female team from International Islamic University Islamabad participating in the prestigious Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration

The four-member team, representing Pakistan at the 23rd edition of the globally renowned moot court competition, includes Amna Sohrab from Nowshahro Feroze (Sindh), Mohsina Hayat from Chitral (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa), Neha Fatima from Mirpur (Azad Jammu and Kashmir), and Shereen Ali from Jaranwala, Faisalabad.

Their participation marks a historic milestone for the university, as it is the first time that an all-female team from IIUI has competed in the internationally acclaimed arbitration moot.
