DOHA: The 3rd Pakistani Mango Exhibition and Its Products opened on Thursday evening at the Eastern Square of Souq Waqif with the participation of diplomats business leaders media

representatives and community members.

The opening ceremony was inaugurated by Mr Abdulrahman Mohammed Al Naama

seasonal fruits and traditional cuisine. This year's edition is the largest since its launch with more

than 30 Pakistani and local companies and over 30 restaurants and food exhibitors participating.

Visitors can enjoy varieties including Sindhri Chaunsa White Chaunsa Anwar Ratol Dusehri and

Fajri along with other Pakistani fruits such as apricots peaches jamun and chikoo.

Pakistan Ambassador to Qatar Muhammad Aamer thanked the Souq Waqif Organization and the

Government of Qatar for supporting the exhibition for the third consecutive year.

He said Pakistani mangoes have a unique position worldwide while other Pakistani fruits are also

known for their exceptional sweetness and quality. He added that the Government of Pakistan and
