
Qatar Joins Cairo Conference To Combat Islamophobia And Promote Tolerance



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Cairo, August 03 (QNA):The State of Qatar participated in the Second International Conference to Combat Discrimination Against Islam and Muslims, which opened Monday at the headquarters of the Arab League in Cairo.

Held under the theme “Islamophobia: Concept and Practice in the Current Global Context,” the two-day conference brings together representatives from governments, regional and

international organizations, religious institutions and civil society groups to discuss ways to counter hate speech and promote tolerance.

Qatar is represented at the conference by Dr. Yousef Al Siddiqi, Member of the Board of Directors of the Doha International Center for Interfaith Dialogue (DICID), and Amna Abdulrahman Al Sulaiti from Qatar's Permanent Mission to the Arab League.

The conference also features the establishment of a permanent multilateral platform to enhance cooperation among institutions and transform recommendations into practical initiatives supporting dialogue, coexistence and respect for cultural and religious diversity.
