

Pakistani Community Bids Farewell to Ambassadors of Malaysia, South Korea, Vietnam, and Nepal

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Doha, June 13, 2024 – Qatar-based senior journalist Ashraf Siddiqui hosted a farewell breakfast at Sarhad Premium Restaurant, a local fine dining Pakistani restaurant in Doha, Qatar, in honor of the outgoing ambassadors of Malaysia, Nepal, South Korea, and Vietnam.
