US-Based JKLF (Y) Acting Chairman calls for Peaceful Resolution to Kashmir Issue:

MIRPUR (AJK): July 26: US-based Acting Chairman of Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front JKLF (Yasin Malik faction) and Director of the Board of South Asia Democracy Watch USA Raja Muzaffar while weighing the recent US travel advisory on Kashmir has called for taking a constructive approach to resolving the long-standing issue.

"The Indian government's reaction to the US travel advisory on Kashmir is unjustified and misguided," Muzaffar said in a statement reaching from Dallas Texas and released to the media

here on Friday.

"Instead of debating the issue negatively in the media, India and Pakistan should take this advisory as a reminder that Kashmir remains a contentious issue that requires a peaceful resolution", the JKLF (Y) leader suggested both the neighbouring nuclear powers, the message said.

"Let's focus on finding a peaceful solution rather than reacting defensively," Muzaffar urged. "It's time for the world super powers to put due interests of the Kashmiri people, the premier stake
