MIRPUR (AJK): Aug. 4 (APP): Urging Kashmiri masses to observe 5th August as exploitation day, the Jammu Kashmir National Front (JKNF) has said that the day marks the onset of India's settler colonial project that seeks to control, by all means, Kashmir, its population and resources.

In a statement issued here Sunday, the JKNF vice chairman Altaf Hussain Wani, while castigating the BJP government for its aggressive designs in the region, said that 5th August move was an atrocious assault on Kashmiris' national identity.
